The University of Michigan Library and Asia Library are pleased to present 2017 Workshop on Korean Data Services at the University of Michigan Library, November 15-16, 2017.

This is a two-day in-depth data services boot camp for (but not limited to) Korean studies librarians, East Asian studies librarians, and Korean studies researchers in North America. In this workshop, attendees will gain hands-on experience with Korean spatial and numeric data and GIS data, particularly those data provided by KOSSDA (Korean Social Science Data Archive) and KOSIS (Korean Statistical Information Service). Also they will learn about reliable data sources related to Korea, China, and Japan from international governmental organizations, East Asian government agencies, and commercial vendors.
