

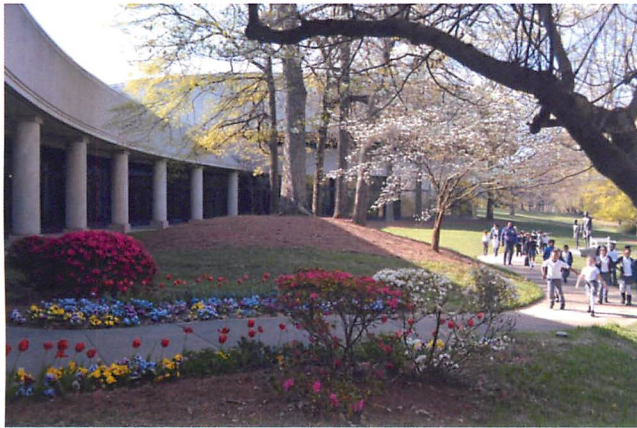

In April, 2013, Rosalynn Carter wanted to establish a butterfly garden at her home in Plains, Georgia to bring public awareness to the declining monarch butterfly population and to encourage the conservation of butterflies and their habitats. Within a few months, eleven public butterfly gardens in Plains had sprung up, many at historic sites, creating the foundation of the *Rosalynn Carter Butterfly Trail*.

The trail has now grown to include over 300 public, private and school gardens across the United States, as well as in Canada and Japan.

On October 1, 2014, a pollinator garden was also established at The Carter Presidential Center in honor of President Jimmy Carter's 90th birthday.
