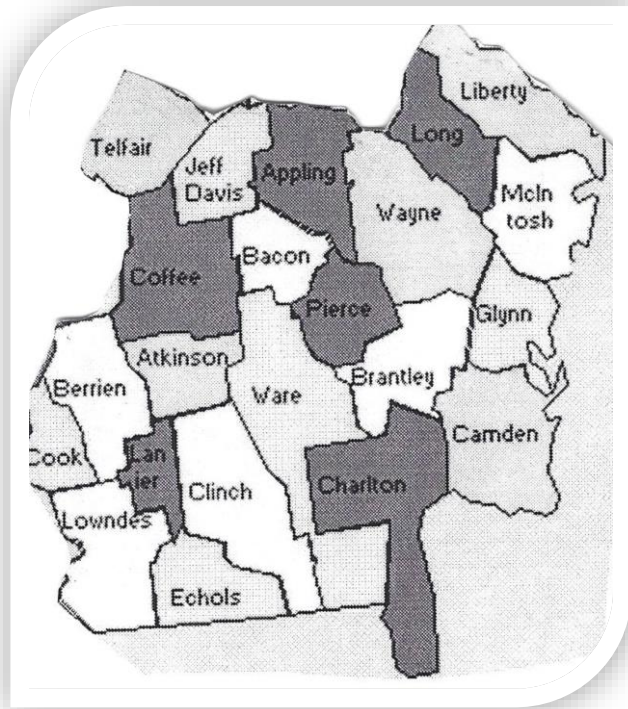

RULES:

2. Contestants will be required to identify a number of trees or leaf sprays of trees. Contestants will be judged on accuracy of the identification.
3. The team with the highest total score will be the team winner in each division. The individual with the highest score will be the individual winner.

Students will identify no more than 75 items from the following combined areas. Students will receive an appropriate score for each item depending on the amount of items presented. Students may be required to identify the item from actual samples, a mounted or preserved sample, a photograph, a written description or a sign of the items, such as a track or a fruit or cone. A word bank will be provided to students at the competition.

Grading: These items will be graded either correct or incorrect, with students receiving appropriate score on each item.
